STATUS OF WOMEN & INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

Our committee has enjoyed meeting monthly and working together. As a result of our discussions and organisation we have successfully undertaken a number of projects including the Young Women in Public Affairs Award, the Woman of Achievement Award, and the Lucy Bohan Bursary.

From the strong field of applicants sent by schools in the Club's catchment area, Lucy McNicol of Mt Lawley High School was chosen as the Club's recipient of the Young Women in Public Affairs Award for 1994. It was with great pleasure that Club members saw her presented with a \$300 university bursary for 1995 and heard her skilfully deliver a speech telling about her life and views at the '94 June meeting. Lucy has been active in a large number of community and school affairs including representation of her school in the Penguin Speak Up Awards, participation in the Young Achievers' Programme, active membership of the school environmental club, participation in the under seventeen State netball championships, netball coaching, member of the school swimming team, an active member of the Girl Guides Association, and a member of the City of South Perth Pipe Band. Later in 1994 Lucy went on to become the winner of the Area 3 Young Women in Public Affairs Award which was presented during November at the Founders' Dinner in Bunbury.

The committee, on behalf of the Club, nominated Mrs Glynis Sibosado for the Woman of Achievement Award. Glynis was chosen as the Area 3 winner and this award was also presented at the November Founders' Dinner. Glynis is from the Kimberley where she is well known and held in the highest regard for her work in the Aboriginal community. She is currently serving as an ATSIC Commissioner and is a regular commuter between WA and Canberra. It was indeed an honour to hear Glynis speak of her life's adventures and work at the Founders' Dinner and to share her warm humour, humility and sense of purpose.

The Lucy Bohan Awardee was presented with a bursary at a club meeting during the latter half of 1994. The recipient is a person who is in either second or third year nursing at Edith Cowan University and who requires financial assistance in order to complete their degree. The selection schedule has been reviewed so that the bursary can now be awarded during the first half of the academic year. The 1995 Awardee was selected by April 1995 and will be awarded the bursary during the May meeting.

The committee has exchanged greeting cards with our friendship clubs in Northern America, Asia, Africa and Europe. Books and school materials have been collected to send overseas to schools in Africa, although feasible transport arrangements are still being investigated.

At most monthly club meetings, a member of our committee has prepared and delivered an awareness slot. The awareness slot is used to raise the awareness of club members about a variety of women's and/or international issues.

Ideas are being explored for our committee to pursue and develop throughout the coming 95/96 year. These ideas include a team building day for interested club members, support of women's health seminars in conjunction with the Dietitian's Association, and support of migrant women through providing friendship and mentors from within the club.

The committee comprises Helen Barton, Sue Brennan, Marion Brown, Yvonne Cole, Margaret Field, Danielle Gallegos, Robina Wright, and Lou Morrison (Chair). Each member of the committee has been totally supportive and very generous with their time and energy. It has indeed been both a pleasure and an honour for me to work with each member of the committee.
