#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my privilege to present the 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of the Zonta Club of Perth Northern Suburbs Inc. Once again, we have exceeded our fundraising goals and passed on the proceeds to many deserving individuals and organisations.

We have continued to support women to further their education through the TAFE Scholarship and the Lucy Bohan Bursary. This year we added an Award of Excellence for a migrant woman to our efforts to advance the status of women, while continuing to encourage youth through our Youth Awards and the Young Women in Public Affairs Award.

We have showcased our organisational talents to Clubs in Area 3 with the wonderful 80. Anniversary Founders' Day Dinner (thanks to Dianne Bryant, June Fowler, Alison Martin, Kaye Metaxas and Judith Rossi), and also to the wider community with the ZISVAW-BADV Breakfast (thanks to Kay Poustie, Dianne Bryant, Judy Farrell, Anne Markey and Anita Sutton).

We continue to assist our fledgling Swan Hills Club, and we have the best record in Area 3 for support of other Club's functions. We were also well-represented at the District 23 Conference in Adelaide (five members attended) and at least five members are also planning to go to the International Convention in Hawaii.

The continued enthusiasm and seemingly boundless energy within the Club have not only made these achievements possible but, I believe, also attract new members to our Club and has resulted in six new members being inducted this year. Welcome to Helena Coleman-Roy, Marlene Whittington, Gail Courtis, Margaret Foo, Vivien Hodder and Deborah Sykes. However we have also lost six members, primarily due to pressure of family and work commitments, so our numbers remain stable at 37, making us one of the largest clubs in District 23.

Lastly, thanks to the Program Committee – Maggie Schmiedte and Rosemary Tait – who continue to provide us with interesting guest speakers.

This has been an unusual year because of the absence at various times of several of our Wise Women. Kay Poustie and Bobbie Craig took leave of absence for well-earned breaks, Gillian Cuss departed to the Deep South and Dawn Newman is enjoying an extended overseas holiday to mark the beginning of her retirement. These four Zontians represent the combined experience of four Club Presidents, three Area Directors, two District Governors and two Centurions. We are indeed fortunate to have such a wealth of Zonta knowledge in our Club.

I am really looking forward to the next biennium. Our Club will be in the very capable hands of Dianne Bryant, who I know is going to be a wonderful President. We will also have our own Alison Martin as Area 3 Director and Peel's Liz Woodgate as District 23 Lieutenant Governor.

Thank you for your support over the last two years. It has been a real pleasure being President of such a vibrant, enthusiastic and caring group of women.

#### INTERCITY

The Intercity Committee met every 2/3 months during the 1999/2000 period, promoting closer relationships through the sharing of Zontian ideals and objectives. Young Women in Public Affairs Award interviews were conducted during May 1999. The winner, Michelle Hand from St Stephen's School, delivered most impressive speeches at both the Club Award evening and the Founders' Dinner where she was presented as the Area 3 winner.

The first Migrant Women's Outreach Seminar took place during September. Six women from a range of countries spoke of their experiences as migrants to Australia and their paths into the workplace. Both the Zonta members and migrant women who attended the afternoon at the Mirrabooka Migrant Centre found the speakers inspirational. We look forward to this becoming an annual event.

We were very pleased to nominate Maureen Felton for the Woman of Achievement Award on behalf of the Club. Maureen has been a voluntary fund-raiser who began her volunteer career in 1984 when she became Mrs Australia, W.A. From this time she has primarily carried out her volunteer work with Rocky Bay Village.
