Status of Women, International Relations, United Nations & Amelia Earhart

A busy year indeed for our SOW Committee. Members included Margaret Field, Dr Danielle Gallegos, Dorothy Hribar, Rosemary Tait and Helena Coleman-Roy (Chairman).

Young Women in Public Affairs interviews were conducted early in May 2003. Natalie Garcia de Heer of Perth College was the recipient of the \$500 YWIPA Award.

The Club's nomination for the Woman of Achievement Award was Jeanette Hamilton, a volunteer worker for Lifeline and also a Suicide Prevention trainer.

Dr Danielle Gallegos organised two very interesting Migrant Women's forums. The first was held at the Edmund Rice Centre in Mirrabooka and attended by 30 Iraqi, Iranian and Somali women. The second, at the Uniting Church in Mt Pleasant, was attended by Hazara Afghani women.

These were safety-related seminars given by Acting Sergeant Jennifer Milligan with drinks and light lunch funded by an Office of Women's Policy Migrant Funding grant of \$1,200.

Guest speaker for the United Nations October meeting was Dr Danielle Gallegos who related anecdotes and stories of the hardships suffered by refugees. Jodie Sanders once again very graciously hosted the dinner at her Trigg home.

Michelle Over received the club's \$1,000 Lucy Bohan Bursary to assist with completion of her degree. The newly designed criteria will be implemented for the next round of interviews.

Our first fully funded ZISVAW camp was held at the Port Kennedy Camp in October 2003. In January 2004 the second of the fully funded camps was conducted at the Keith Maine Camp at Whiteman Park. Activities during the afternoons were many and varied and enjoyed by all.

Amelia Earhart: In January 2004 the Swan Hills Club organised an extremely interesting visit that included lunch at Pearce Air Base.

Marion Brown was guest speaker at the February 2004 dinner meeting.

A total of 40 advanced native shrubs for the eight Zonta Houses (refuges) were donated by the City of Melville, thus considerably improving the surrounds.

Legislation Awareness was supported by Perth Northern Suburbs members. As a club we saw the proposed legislation relate to Female Genital Mutilation amendments in the Criminal Code Amendment Bill 2003.

A huge thank you to the SOW Committee members for your efforts, enthusiasm and fellowship.
