### **Sue Bigelow Award**

In recognition of Sue Bigelow, a member who sadly passed away from cancer in 2005, the Club assisted the WA Chapter of the Australian Association of Special Education Inc. establish the Sue Bigelow Award. Sue was a highly valued committee member of AASE at both state and national levels, and held executive positions for over 20 years. As a Special Education teacher, she had a commitment to the special educational needs of students. The Award will be made annually to a teacher of students with special needs in the secondary school sector. In 2006 the Award went to Suzanne Groves.

### **Other Projects**

This year the Committee have been pursuing potential opportunities for a major project within the local area. Potential options have included assisting women in prison, working with Magenta to assist trafficked women and facilitating the development of young Aboriginal women. Late in 2006 we successfully worked with the Balga Senior High School to facilitate a day for young Aboriginal women to help build their self esteem. ### **Public Relations & Communications**

In April 2006 I took over the role of Chairman of this Committee from Anastasia Maslij who had been at the helm for five years. Following are some of our achievements over the year.

### "The Zontapreneur"

In July it was decided that instead of a quarterly newsletter it would be more effective to have a monthly news sheet that would be transmitted electronically prior to each dinner meeting. This has been received very well.

#### Member Handbook

A decision was made to revert back to an alphabetical listing for the Member Handbook and to distribute this electronically. Updates to major information will occur each August. An A5 "No Fuss " list with handy access to members' telephone numbers and e-mail addresses has also been produced for electronic distribution.

### Young Women in Public Affairs Award

It was decided by the Club in 2006 that it was more in keeping with the goals of Zonta International to focus on the Young Women in Public Affairs Awards rather than the Club's Youth Awards that had been running annually for 16 years as a PR initiative. It was therefore agreed to discontinue the Youth Awards and divert these energies towards a Gala Dinner for the YWPA Awards. The PR&C and SOWSA Committees now work in close collaboration. Whilst the SOWSA are responsible for sourcing candidates, interviewing and selecting finalists, the PR&C Committee arrange sponsorship and publicity. This is working very well and will be continued in the future.

### **Publicity**

The PR&C Committee organised publicity for a wide range of events that included the YWPA Awards, the Club's 25<sup>th</sup> Birthday Celebration, the UNIFEM Spring Walk, and the Garage Sale fundraiser. The Committee is also responsible for arranging publicity for the Celebrity Platters Project event taking place in October. Monthly dinner meeting notices are also posted in the local press. We continue to look for additional media outlets and ways to improve the profile of the Club.

#### Website

Work has been ongoing and the Club's new website is about to be launched. I would like to acknowledge the assistance given by Dominique Raubenheimer (SOWSA Committee member) who volunteered to work on this task with Anastasia Maslij.

### **Birthing Kits**

In 2006, Jacqui Alder orchestrated two extremely successful birthing kit workshops one at TAFE to celebrate International Women's Day and the other at Edith Cowan University's School of Nursing. A total of 2,975 kits was assembled and sent to Vietnam and Papua New Guinea for distribution.

### **Spring Walk**

On 22 October, Zontians trekked to Star Swamp Trigg to participate in the Spring Walk for UNIFEM. Accompanied by Eoin Cameron from ABC 720 Radio who promoted the walk on his breakfast program, Zontians, family, friends and supporters raised about \$700 for this United Nations program.
