STATUS OF WOMEN, SERVICE & ADVOCACY REPORT

Members of this Committee in 2007 included Antoinette Allison, Laurel Coyle, Mandy Ewers, Margaret Field, Danielle Gallegos (Chairman), Vicki Moir, Sue Pertile and Liz Wason. We bade farewell to our Chairman Danielle Gallegos in November and Kay Poustie assumed this role. In February 2008, Miriam Blakemore was welcomed to the Committee. Fun and fellowship was enjoyed by all.

Balga High School Aboriginal Girls' Development Days

This program, organised by Margaret Field, in liaison with Rusty Hazel (school coordinator), was conducted over two days, 2-3 July 2007. About 15 girls participated and the focus was on personal care, deportment, confidence building activities and healthy eating, all integrated with jewellery making sessions. Specialists were engaged or volunteered to facilitate the activities. This was a labour intensive program and many club members gave of their time and expertise, especially Mary Leonard, Anne Markey, Anita Sutton and Beth Daebritz who managed the catering, Alma Dempsey who offered pastoral care and Dawn Newman who photographed the girls and made up their certificates for presentation. The program was held over two years, and although generally successful, members decided to discontinue it, as despite the hard work, the desired outcomes were not fully achieved.

Young Women in Public Affairs Award

Many hours of preparation went into this award as we contacted over 40 high schools in the northern suburbs. The winner for 2007 was Georgina Fraser, Head Girl, Mount Lawley Senior High School. Georgina was presented with her award of \$1000 at a Gala Evening held on 1 August, celebrating the achievements of young women in our community. This was organised by the combined efforts of the SOWSA and the PR&C Committees. The four finalists all impressed us with their speeches, as did Caitlyn Rice, the 2006 winner.

Birthing Kits

New member Mandy Ewers, assisted by Vicki Moir, organised this assembly morning which was held at the East Claremont Primary School on 18 August, 2007.

There was a great turnout of 47 helpers, including 16 members and 31 volunteers. A total of 997 kits was assembled, packed, and sent to Myanmar (Burma.) This was an opportunity for great fellowship and a scrumptious morning tea was supplied by Club members.

Spring Walk

The Spring Walk for UNIFEM was held at Star Swamp, Watermans Bay on 23 September. Unfortunately it was poorly attended as many members were still returning from District Conference in Hobart. However, at the October meeting, many members contributed to the cause and a sizeable cheque was sent to UNIFEM

Lucy Bohan Nursing Bursary

This award is named after Lucy Bohan who was President of the Zonta Club of Perth Northern Suburbs from 1982 to 1984. Lucy held the position of Principal Director of Nursing with the WA Health Department. Interviewing for the year's award was held at Edith Cowan University on 19 October, 2007. Zontian Laurel Coyle met with two representatives from the university and selected Noelene Costello as a most worthy recipient. Noelene spoke at our November meeting. She is a single mother of two and intended to use the \$1000 award for both education expenses and to support her children while she is on clinical rotation.

Suzanne Bigelow Award

The Club initiated this award in memory of our past member, Sue Bigelow, who passed away in 2005. Sue was a Special Education Teacher at Newman College and for over 20 years she held executive positions in professional organisations at both state and national levels. The award is made annually to a secondary school student with special needs. In 2007 the award went to Justin Vittiglia.

Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship

After trying unsuccessfully to find a recipient for this award, our Club joined with other Area 3 clubs to establish an Area 3 Award. Danielle Gallegos represented the Zonta Club of Perth Northern Suburbs on an Area Committee and Rachel Thomson was the successful recipient. Rachel received \$1000 and went on to become the District 23 Awardee.

Trafficking of Women

The SOWSA Committee investigated ways of better informing our members on issues related to the trafficking of women. As an initial response, it was decided that we become members of Project Respect, a non-government organisation which challenges exploitation of and violence against women in the sex industry. Kay Poustie led a workshop on the issue at the Hobart Conference in September and an education program for our Club will follow.

Woman of Achievement

In 2007 the nominee was sourced by Kerry Coyle who used her considerable journalistic skills to compile our nomination of Diane Annear, past CEO of the Zonta House Refuge. Diane now leads the Women's Legal Referral Service. Unfortunately our submission was unsuccessful.
