

President's Message

At the beginning of my year as President I praised the collective work of the Presidents before me which has culminated in our club providing 30 years of service. We still have two original members, Margaret and Alma, and the daughter of Gwen, Bronwyn, a testament to our ability to retain members. I also spoke about casting our net further and to fish wider. Well, looking back have we achieved this?

A resounding yes!! We have definitely managed to get the name of Zonta out there to people who have never heard of us. Firstly the Bunnings Sausage Sizzle, serving hundreds of people seeing our T-shirts and asking about us, and not forgetting the staff at Bunnings who now see us as a very well organised, reliable and committed group. It is certainly not just about raising the funds, although \$2000 is a fantastic result.

The International Women's Day events also gave publicity to Zonta, and we managed to get good PR from our contribution, including radio and several local papers. The Birthing Kit Assembly Workshop attracted 90 non-Zontian participants, as well as the many helpers from the previous Birthing Kit Day, and they in turn also talk to others about it. The Breast Cushions are not only assisting with recovery, but are also gaining recognition for Zonta which is apparent from the letters of thanks and donations we receive.

Our nomination for the 2011 Premier's Australia Day Active Citizenship Award for providing advocacy to our local community by raising funds for a variety of projects and awards which assist women to improve their legal, economic, educational, health and professional status since 1981 was also highlighting our presence to an assembled group of people, some previously knowing nothing about Zonta

It was also very pleasing to see our Migrant Safety Seminars being recognised and being nominated for the 2011 Western Australian Multicultural Community Service Awards. This award was recognising non-government organisations who achieve excellence in advancing multiculturalism, inclusiveness and participation in the provision of services to culturally and linguistically diverse communities. We have one of our founding members, Margaret Field to thank for this wonderful initiative. This has also increased awareness of Zonta at the community and migrant centres involved as well as building links with the police, and also those attending the function, including several politicians and the Minister for Multicultural Interests.



Service Committee

REFUGEE WOMEN'S SAFETY SEMINARS

Following the receipt of funding of \$2520 from the WA Office of Multicultural Interests, seven Safety Seminars were conducted throughout 2010. Liaison with the WA Police resulted in three police officers presenting 'security' talks – Snr Constable Raymond Lee of Warwick Police Station, 1st Class Constable Glynis Ozies and Snr Sergeant Don Emanuel-Smith of Mirrabooka Police Station. We are indebted to them for their input. Overall this was a very successful project with positive outcomes achieved by all stake holders including the refugee women, Migrant Centre Coordinators, Police Officers, interpreters and participating Zontians. Approximately 150 Refugee women attended, and in a very welcoming atmosphere, received valuable information on Australian law and personal safety.

YOUNG WOMEN IN PUBLIC AFFAIRS AWARD

Details for this award were sent to over 40 schools in the Perth northern suburbs. Three outstanding finalists were selected from interviews and they subsequently spoke at a Gala Dinner held at Lake Karrinyup Country Golf Club on August 4, 2010. It was attended by School Principals, parents, friends and important members of the community. Bishop Kay Goldsworthy was the MC and announced the winner. The 2009 winner, Rachel Hunter, spoke of her experiences in her first year at university. Thanks to the efforts of our PR Committee, Zonta received extensive exposure in the press, and our guest, the Hon Liz Behjat MLC, recognised the value of the YWPA program in a speech given to the WA Legislative Council on 10 August 2010, and recorded in Hansard.

UN GUEST SPEAKER AND UN WOMEN WALK

The October 6 United Nations Night was opened by District 23 UN Chairman Anastasia Maslij, who gave an overview of UN achievements. She then introduced the Guest Speaker, Dr Barbara Nattabi, a Medical Doctor from Uganda who is currently completing a PhD at Curtin University. Barbara held us in awe as she spoke of her medical experiences in her war torn country. Later, on October 24, Dr Nattabi led the UN WOMEN Walk at Star Swamp. This covered a distance of 5km, the distance an average African woman walks each day to collect water. Nearly 40 women participated and a donation of \$361.40 was sent to UN Women Australia.

WOMAN OF ACHIEVEMENT

The nominee for the Woman of Achievement Award for 2010 was Dianne Annear, a Justice of the Peace and tireless champion of women's interests. For over 35 years she has worked tirelessly in the cause of women forced to leave

their homes, due to domestic violence. In 2000, Dianne established the Women's Legal Referral Service which was a natural evolution from the Zonta Women's refuge she had previously set up. This was a service that assisted domestic violence victims to pursue property settlements and move from a violent situation to a fear free environment. Dianne was also successful in obtaining \$200,000 in funding through the Legal Service, the Law Society and the State Attorney General's Department's which enabled the service to be expanded to the regional areas of the Pilbara, Wheatbelt and South West. This has been a major initiative for women living in regional areas as issues of domestic violence are further complicated by the small areas in which they live and the limited services available to these women.

2010 LUCY BOHAN BURSARY

The deserving winner of the bursary this year, Sarah Rounsevell has three children and therefore has had to be very focussed to achieve her amazing results. She received five High Distinctions and six Distinctions. Not a bad effort for a young girl that left high school at 15. These young mothers never cease to amaze me in their focussed efforts to achieve their goal of becoming a nurse. Sarah achieved these results without her own computer. She now has one thanks to her Bursary payment of \$1000.

BIRTHING KITS

We held our first Birthing Kit assembly day on 28th August 2010 to assemble 1000 kits. Vicki Moir was kind enough to let us use her school, East Claremont Primary school, as we had done previously. We had many community helpers on the day as well as 13 PNS Zontians. Our helpers included 8 staff from Baker Hughes , that Jaquie Alder brought along; 19 friends of Ditza Teng and a student from Churchlands SHS. Thanks to everyone for a great effort on the day. These kits were sent to The Addis Ababa Fistula Hospital in Ethiopia.

BREAST CUSHIONS

We held Breast Cushion assembly days in April and June 2010. We completed 33 cushions and have a further 37 requiring completion. We had a busy end quarter in 2010 and will have three assembly days during the coming year.

PR & C Committee

Whilst only two formal committee meetings were held over the last year, a number of liaisons took place during the year between individual team members. This was brought about because three members of the committee went on leave of absence and others were not always available when meetings were scheduled.

Marilyn Rainier who transferred from the ZC of Perth, joined PR&C for a short time and then moved to Fundraising. During the latter part of 2010 Retha Steenkamp resigned from the club and Anita Sutton moved back to the Membership Committee. This left PR&C with Di Bryant, Kerry Coyle, Robbie Hearse, Hilda Malanczak and myself.

PUBLICITY

Early in the year Kerry Coyle and myself met with Wanneroo Times Journalist, Margaret Price, who has been instrumental in assisting us with media releases and stories

Over the year we have had some good publicity, mainly leading to and following the Young Women in Public Affairs Award Night in August 2010 and more recently in March on the back of International Women's Day, some good articles appeared in several community newspapers relating to our Birthing Kit assembly day in Joondalup. Success has also come from placing dinner speaker notices in the paper, eg **Glenys McDonald's** talk on 'HMAS Sydney' last year and more recently a brief article about **Jackie Pedley's Cambodia** trip. Each month now the committee produce a flyer advertising our dinner meeting speaker and these are distributed via email to members, other clubs in the area and supporters and friends of Zonta. At the beginning of our Zonta year we trialed a classified advertisement in the 'Stirling Times' which read:

"Zonta – good wine, food and friendship. Business and professional women who desire to make a difference. Meet first Wednesday of the month Lake Karrinyup Country Club at 6.30 pm. Call Anita Sutton on 9387 7428 or email anita.sutton@optusnet.com.au."

However, we did not get much response from this so discontinued the idea. We have had much better success with individual articles about club activities and the free monthly meeting notices that go into the 'Wanneroo/Joondalup Times' and 'Stirling Times' when space permits. Members themselves also contribute to our publicity by promoting Zonta to their friends and work colleagues.

PUBLICATIONS

We opted this year to have an updated (generic) version of our club brochure 'What about Zonta?' produced commercially in full glossy colour. A very competitive quote was sourced and this has proved a good move as they have

been well received and are very economical at around 48c each. Members are reminded to utilise this in conjunction with their club business card.

Our club newsletter '*The Zontapreneur'* continues to be produced in colour on a monthly basis and is distributed electronically in PDF format far and wide to past members, other clubs, across the District and to our supporters and friends. We often receive comments about it particularly from past members who like to be kept informed of our activities.

The usual Member Handbook with photos and full details of each member has been delayed this year because of the number

of movements, but will be produced for the start of the new biennium and distributed in an electronic format.

Hilda Malanczak, our webmaster, is undertaking the transfer of our website from 'FrontPage' to 'Dreamweaver'. At the same time the site is being upgraded and modified to give it some pizzazz and make it more attractive to visitors. Members are reminded to visit the site themselves on a frequent basis as Hilda is doing a great job keeping it current with forthcoming dinner meeting speakers, events, etc. The site should be referred to prospective members too as it contains a lot of information about our club and has some useful links.

SCRAPBOOK

Hilda is continuing to maintain our media scrapbook and I would like to thank members for passing onto her paper cuttings and other media items for inclusion.

CONCLUSION

I believe we have achieved a lot this year despite our committee being depleted. Everyone has worked extremely hard and because of this, it has been a rewarding year. However, we must not lose sight of the fact that we are all busy people, most with families and careers to nurture.


