A total of 130 wooden ducks, painted and decorated by local identities. celebrities and artists vielded the amazing amount of \$20,000.

This time, the Membership Committee will follow through to ensure we promote and implement some of the suggestions put forward because it is important for members to feel their comments are being heard and, where possible, acted upon. Young Women in Public Affairs Award

n 2012 two very outstanding students applied I for this award and were invited to attend a Gala Dinner held at Lake Karrinvup Country Club on 1 August. The function was attended by parents, friends, principals, Year 12 coordinators and important members of the community and representatives from our Gold Sponsors, Kott Gunning Lawyers. MC Bishop Kay Goldsworthy again supported this event and announced the winner, Emilie Fitzgerald from St Mary's Anglican Girls' School. Emilie gave an inspiring speech. To conclude a most enjoyable evening. the 2011 YWPA Award winner, Amber Newton, spoke of her experiences in her first year at university and how she is employed part time at her old school.

After reviewing procedures the committee decided in 2012 to seek an appointment with the Year 12 Coordinator of all the local schools, to personally promote this award and be their reference point. The launch for applications was also bought forward a month.

Area 3 Woman of Achievement Award

What a thrill it was to hear our nominee Andrea Creado announced as the Woman of Achievement Awardee at the Area 3 Founder's Dinner held at the Waterside Restaurant in Mandurah on 10 November 2012, especially as we had also been successful the previous year. Andrea has worked tirelessly for women from ethnic backgrounds at the Ishar Multicultural Women's Health Centre, and has been a role model herself rising from a volunteer to CEO.

Lucy Bohan Nursing Bursary

Violetta Zajonz, a young single mother of 4 year old twins, was awarded the 2012 Lucy Bohan Nursing Bursary, announced at Lake Karrinyup Country Club in November. Members of the interview panel from Edith Cowan University joined us for the presentation.

Amelia Earhart Fellowship

This year's annual fundraiser dinner had to be cancelled, however, several members attended an event organised by the Zonta Club of Swan Hills.

Jane M Klausman Women in Business Scholarship

For the first time our club has received applications from a listing on the Edith Cowan University website and also on our club's website.

Zonta Refuge

Vicki Moir is doing a marvellous job on the Board of the Zonta House Women's Refuge and they are gaining grants and making big changes with their strategies to fulfil their vision.

Elizabeth Hansen Autumn Centre

This hostel, located in Maylands, caters for women from remote aboriginal communities in Western Australia who are in Perth for dialysis treatment. These women are regularly transported to Royal Perth Hospital for treatment but have many idle hours on their hands. An art therapy programme has been supported by our club and an Aboriginal Community Innovation Grant was secured for \$3000 from the Aboriginal Health Division of the Department of Health. This money has been used to purchase art supplies and Mary Pfister was appointed Artist-in-Residence who has done a

sterling job in inspiring the women to get involved in artistic expression. An art exhibition was organised by Margaret Field to showcase some of their achievements

Migrant/Refugee Women's Safety Seminars

Congratulations to Vice President, Bronwyn McCormack on securing a grant to run four Migrant/Refugee Women's Safety Seminars.

Breast Cushion Project

Kath Snashall has competently organised six sewing workshops throughout the year for club members, as well as being supported by members of Inner Wheel, making a total of 157 cushions.

Each cushion costs about \$2.50 and are delivered to the Area Breast Cushion Coordinator, Elaine Newman for distribution to hospitals at the rate of about 30 a month. The club has received many letters of appreciation with donations from these grateful recipients totalling \$315.

Birthing Kits

Goollelal Primary School held a gold coin charity collection day and donated \$300 towards purchasing the Birthing Kit supplies.

Our next Birthing Kit Assembly Day is early in April, where we plan to produce 1000 kits with the assistance of staff and students at Churchlands Senior High School. In August 2012 Australia produced its one millionth kit.

UN Women Spring Walk

Our 5 km walk was held on Sunday, 21 October commencing at the Henderson Environment Centre and walking through Star Swamp and North Beach. Fifty-seven participants joined us and over \$500 was raised for UN Women Australia.

Australian Institute of Management Scholarship

Following the club's successful application for an AIM Scholarship, Fran Cramphorn undertook a Project Management Course which aided her in the organisation of the Duck Project. A wonderful achievement and a very successful outcome created initially from this award and of course the inspiration and vision of Di Bryant, with the support and teamwork of all club members, ably lead by Fran.
