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President's Annual Report

Credibility and Visibility

The success of any club is dependent upon the quality of the membership. It is the quality within our club that has made my role so enjoyable and I feel fortunate that I was chosen to walk in the shoes of previous dedicated leaders. My fellow club members have also supported this journey. Every president brings a different set of skills from a diverse range of occupations and career levels where we each will have left a unique mark.

Integral to my president's term have been the women who have served on our club's Board. A close bond unites them. Our discussions are sometimes deep — and it has been the shared knowledge of past presidents that has helped us reach our resolutions in a manner that resonates with Zonta Objects and our Mission. The directors form the bridge that carries us over the changeover periods, when new personnel are elected.

A vital cog around which much of our Board activities revolve is the accuracy of our minute taker and correspondence secretary Kerry Coyle. With her background, a career in journalism and as a qualified editor, our minutes have been concise and well written (though not entirely without fault — we have occasionally credited the wrong area of Zonta in our inward correspondence. However, receipt of the mail is faithfully recorded).

Our elected Vice President Bronwyn McCormack had been making a valuable contribution until her decision

to retire from the Board brought about a change. This coincided with the expiry of our two-year term Directors when Sue Taylor and Hilda Malanczak left to make room for newly elected directors Marilyn Ide and Fran Cramphorn. Our big challenge was to find a replacement VP, who would not only fill this position but, hopefully, also carry on to become president as our club normally accepts. It was the Board decision that a past president be approached, as this person would have the experience to make a seamless transition. Leanne Sultan filled this vacancy very smoothly and efficiently, bringing with it her experience of being a past Area Director. The Board had no qualms — and neither did the membership, who gratefully accepted her offer. We have yet to follow through formally with the election process at an annual meeting.

Then our time with Fran ended earlier than expected. We understand the problems associated with an ageing parent and sadly accepted her resignation from the Board, who have granted her leave of absence. Marilyn continues to carry out her director duties, lately without the extra obligation of co-chairing the Fundraising Committee.

Anastasia Maslij is another past president on the Board who has managed our finances while serving her third and final term as treasurer. She has dealt with our accounts and payments in a timely manner keeping a firm hand and eye on our expenditure.



June Fowler and Judith Rossi have both been responsible for the not-so-straightforward task of taking the bookings and dealing with the seating arrangements for our dinner meetings each month. Non-arrivals / late apologies / unexpected guests are matters they cope with extremely well and we are so thankful that Lake Karrinyup Country Club is understanding and flexible about this issue. As a serving member of 28 years, June provides wise counsel and direction during our discussions.

The committee structure within our club is beneficial to our understanding of how the club operates. Monthly reports kept us informed of their operations.

Our club has had a very busy biennium as we centered activities on our Service projects, including the hugely successful Decorated Ducks, which has recently enabled us to announce and finance the first of the projected Special Camps specified in the Aim of the Project, and in accordance with the Zonta International ZISVAW programme.

Running parallel to that project, initial steps were under way for the next big item on our club agenda — District 23 Conference. Using the excellent administration skills of PDG Alison Martin, we hosted this at the Rendezvous Hotel in Scarborough. The report for this appears elsewhere. However, as president of the host club, I must say I was so proud for many reasons. They included the manner in

which it was organised, the support given by our club members (who turned up in force), their willingness to be involved and, at the end of it all, for them to then share in the kudos heaped upon our club for the attention to detail in every facet of that major undertaking. It gave our newer members a better understanding of what attending a Zonta Conference is all about, and an appreciation of how very friendly and approachable our district and international office bearers are.

In October, we addressed matters raised in the club's questionnaire circulated some 12 months earlier, the outcome being delayed due to our heavy programme. The Membership team conducted the evening at the end of which members expressed their satisfaction with the way it was handled and the manner in which everyone was given a voice through the chosen system. Thanks to Bronwyn McCormack, who initiated and circulated the questionnaire, and Chair Vicki Moir, who coordinated the final analysis.

As the curtain came down on this hugely eventful year, our members staggered into the peace and serenity of December and a well-earned Christmas break. The weather was kind to us for our No Frills Christmas Night. Among our guests, including husbands and partners, were Zonta Refugee staff, who received an abundance of gifts supplied by members plus our annual



monetary donation. Kerry Coyle introduced an elderly friend of Zonta, Maria, who had made many bags to be used as gifts for the refuge. The cooks on our Board provided an array of food — nibbles, salads and desserts, while a couple of husbands - Brian Ide and Geoff Green — operated the barbecue. My man Ambrose filled the title role of maitre d' and general gofer. There were lucky door prizes to be claimed and after such a busy year, it was with much relief that we began closing doors on our Zonta Club for 2013 — but not before one final flurry of activity. Four members attended a gift-wrapping day at the refuge in Bateman, sorting a pile of donated items, and then selectively dividing them into some 50+ smartly wrapped presents.

Towards the end of January, and under the chairmanship of Area 3 Director Carole Theobald, we were back in harness when our VP Leanne Sultan, Fran Cramphorn and I met to discuss and set about laying the groundwork for the Area Workshop, which our club, in turn, is organising for 2014. Unfortunately, Fran withdrew, but not before fulfilling her initial promise to secure our venue at Heathcote. AD Carole has located speakers and done much of the programme detail, so our members are mainly taking care of the general operational duties for the day, such as registrations, catering and the raffle. This will be taking place on Saturday, 10 May.

Club meetings resumed in February, as we set about planning our basic programme for this coming year. We voted in order of preference for our general and financial obligations and we maintained our dedication to the service projects and awards throughout the year. Using that information, committees have responded with their various timelines, so our diaries and calendar pages are regularly updated.

Another important matter occupying the club at this time of the year is finding incoming office bearers for our 2014-16 Board. This year, we require an almost full complement so the Nominations Committee of Kath Snashall and Dawn Newman, under the chairmanship of Jean Wyder, have had a busy time. The slate, as filled so far, was presented at our April meeting and personnel to fill the remaining vacancies are either being canvassed, or may be accepted, in the appropriate manner from the floor, at our annual general meeting on Wednesday, 7 May.

It is also the president's responsibility to handle matters of bereavement. A number of cards/flowers were sent to several such affected members, some of whom had also to travel overseas at short notice. This recognition included cards for Zonta members in other clubs.

The motto of our International President Lynn McKenzie throughout her biennium has been 'Credibility and Visibility'. In all our activities over this

period, we have not only been mindful of them, but we have made an effort to apply them. Promotional avenues have given us a great deal of visibility thanks to the diligence of our PR team, where Dawn Newman especially has worked hard to establish our profile and maintain contacts with local papers and publications.

Credibility is important to our long-term survival. We need to ensure we are well governed while continuing to advocate for and support women who are new to Australia as migrants and women who need a voice, for through them too we gain credibility. As long as we continue to reward young women for their participation in our Zonta International programmes and recognise the achievements of those many women who do so much at home and abroad often while passing under the community radar, we will sustain our relevance and further our credibility in the wider community.

In closing this annual report and reviewing the biennium during which I have been club president, I thank all our members for allowing me the pleasure, and indeed the honour, of serving you in this capacity. It has been a most stimulating period, I have been taught much, and I now hand over the wellbeing of this Zonta Club of Perth Northern Suburbs to our incoming and experienced Zontian, Vice President Leanne Sultan, who will restore all to order, once again.

Status of Women Service

Young Women in Public Affairs Award

The Gala Dinner was held in July, one month earlier than usual, as our District Conference was held here in Perth this year and many club members were involved in its organisation. Zontians were appointed as School Contacts to personally contact Year 12 Coordinators of local schools and promote the award.

We interviewed five outstanding students and invited three to attend the Gala Dinner held at Lake Karrinyup Country Club on 3 July. Parents, friends, principals, Year 12 coordinators, important members of the community and representatives from our Gold Sponsors, Kott Gunning Lawyers, all attended the dinner. Each student gave an inspiring speech and all were worthy applicants. It had been difficult for the interview panel to select the winner. MC Bishop Kay Goldsworthy again supported this event and announced the winner—Karri Coles, from Perth Modern School. Unfortunately, the 2012 YWPA Award winner, Emilie Fitzgerald, was unable to attend this year.

Area 3 Woman of Achievement Award

This award is two yearly, so no award was presented in 2013.

Lucy Bohan Nursing Bursary

Rocheal-Lee Lock, a mother of five, was awarded the 2013 Lucy Bohan Nursing Bursary, in November. Members of the interview panel from Edith Cowan University joined us for the presentation at Lake Karrinyup Country Club.

Amelia Earhart Fellowship

This year's annual fundraiser dinner had to be cancelled.

Jane M Klausman Women in Business Scholarship

Applications were received from Christina Allen and Lori-Ann Shibish, who were both studying at Edith Cowan University, Joondalup. The applications were forwarded to Donella Caspersz, of the Zonta Club of Perth, who chairs the Area 3 Jane M Klausman scholarship programme. The Area 3 winner, Natalie Meyer, who was nominated by Perth, was subsequently announced as the District 23 winner.

Zonta Refuge

Vicki Moir resigned from her position on the Board of the Zonta House Women's Refuge and we are very fortunate that Rosemary Donovan has stepped into her shoes.

Birthing Kits

Goollelal Primary School held a Mother's Day morning tea and collected \$430 towards purchasing supplies to make birthing kits.

We held a stand at the Pregnancy, Babies and Children Expo at Claremont showground with the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia). Members from other clubs assisted at the stand. Our participation not only promoted the birthing kits and raised donations (\$2526.60 was deposited into the BKF(A) account), it also increased the visibility of Zonta in the wider community.



UN Women Spring Walk

The venue was changed this year to Lake Monger where 36 participants walked around the picturesque lake and \$440 was raised for UN Women Australia.

Breast Cushion Project

Kath Snashall organised two sewing workshops this year for members of Inner Wheel, making 57 cushions. Club members attended a workshop and made a further 12, so 69 were forwarded to project coordinator Elaine Newman to be distributed to hospitals.



Elizabeth Hansen Autumn Centre

An application for a grant was submitted however, funds were unavailable. Dianna Coyne has resigned her position as the centre's manager so we will seek to clarify future needs with her replacement.

Migrant/Refugee Women's Safety Seminars

This programme is in abeyance until we find a new coordinator and gain funds for another grant.

Advocacy Committee

A separate committee was formed to concentrate our efforts on advocacy, with members Molly McCaffrey, Fran Cramphorn, Kerry Coyle and Anastasia Maslij. Molly gave a presentation and outline of the Committee's vision and strategic plan at the club's February planning meeting. A petition supplied by Kedy Kristal, Chief Executive Officer of the Patricia Giles Centre, was circulated for individual members' consideration. The petition contains a review of women currently serving sentences for homicide in view of changes to the *Homicide Act 2008* regarding domestic homicide with a history of violence.

Service Recognition Award

We submitted our project 'Domestic Violence Support for mothers and children who have experienced the trauma of domestic violence and living in a refuge' to our District Governor for consideration in Category 2—service projects to prevent violence against women and girls. We were delighted to learn that our submission, with only one other club's submission from our District in this category, has been selected and forwarded to the Zonta International Service Committee for judging.

We were sorry to lose Liz Wason to the Membership Committee but were fortunate to welcome two new members, Rosemary Donovan and Stephanie Steensma, into our fold. Thanks to all members of the committee for their valued commitment to service.

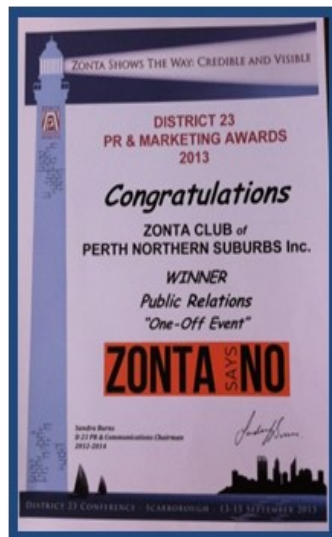
