In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the association's preparation of the statement that gives a true and fair view, in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the association's internal control. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

## Independence

In conducting my audit I have complied with the independence requirements of Australian professional ethical pronouncements.

### Opinion

In my opinion, the Special Purpose Financial Report fairly reflects, in all material aspects, the financial performance for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2015.

#### Inherent Uncertainty regarding the Completeness of Donations and Subscriptions

Without qualification to the opinion expressed above, attention is drawn to the following matter.

As is common for associations of this type, it is not practicable for Zonta Club of Perth Northern Suburbs Inc. to maintain an effective system of internal control over donations, subscriptions and other fund raising activities until their initial entry into the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to these income items was limited to amounts recorded.

## **Basis of Accounting**

The Special Purpose Financial Report has been prepared to assist Zonta Club of Perth Northern Suburbs Inc. to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (WA). As a result, the Special Purpose Financial Report may not be suitable for another purpose.

A total of 143 cushions were forwarded to Elaine Newman, Area 3 Breast Cushions Coordinator for distribution to WA hospitals. We received letters of thanks and about \$235 in donations from Inner Wheel and recipients of the cushions.



#### **Birthing Kits**

Hilda Malanczak organised a Birthing Kit Workshop at Churchlands Senior High School in June. Eighty-four volunteers attended, many of whom had been involved in previous kit assembly days. There was a mix of Zontians and their friends (some doctors, lawyers, engineers, male and female) along with Year 10, 11 and 12 students from Churchlands SHS. It was great to see such a variety of people volunteering for such a wonderful project. Many comments were made about how everyone worked positively together enjoyed learning new things. Thev successfully compiled 1000 kits which were dispatched to the DR Congo.

During 8-10 Aug 2014 our committee organised volunteers for a stand at the Pregnancy, Babies and Children Expo Claremont Showground in conjunction with Kit Birthing Foundation (Australia). Members from other clubs also assisted in manning the stand. This not only promoted the Birthing Kits and raised donations of \$2,637 which was deposited into the BKF(A) account, it certainly increased the visibility of Zonta.
